Remember, your bags are YOURS until the driver puts them in the truck. If you have issues with birds & critters, put your bags in a can/container/bin or cover them with a tarp/blanket. If you use a container/bin, make sure it is marked in some way to identify for the driver that the container/bin contains bags. If your bags are torn apart before the truck arrives, it is your responsibility to clean up the mess. To prevent garbage disasters, keep your garbage bags and cans/containers/bins inside until the morning of your collection day.

Tip: covering bags with a tarp or old blanket keeps the birds away.



Dog Licence:

All dogs over 6 months of age are required to be licenced under By-Law 2012-3. Licence forms can be found on our website or stop by the Office to purchase a licence. A municipal dog tag is valid from January 1st to December 31st each given year and is the most successful means of identification.



Animal Control:

To report a lost/found dog, dogs running at large or dogs that are a public nuisance (persistent barking/howling), call Frontenac Municipal Law Enforcement at 613-541-3213.

Burn Permits:

If you are having an open air controlled burn you MUST purchase & activate a burn permit. Permits are available at rl.burnpermits.com. On our website, check out the Emergency Services page under the Live tab for more information. Before you burn, call the Burn Permit Activation Line at 1-833-853-3473 as a burn ban could go in place at any time. Campfires no larger than 3'x3'x3' do not require a burn permit. During Fire Season, which runs from April 1 to Oct 31, open air burning is only permitted after 6pm and before 8am with an activated permit.

Election:

The 2026 Municipal Election will take place on Monday, October 26th via telephone and internet. All Election information will be available on the election website at election.rideaulakes.ca.

CURBSIDE COLLECTION — ALL BAGS MUST BE OUT BY 7:00 am



Garbage

Each household is entitled to place 3 bags of household garbage out each week. Household garbage must be in a clear bag (no colour) with a current Rideau Lakes bag tag (\$2.50) attached, weighing less than 40 lbs. All bags set out for collection must be tied and your bag tag must be clearly visible to the driver. During hot weather, freeze decaying material as bags will not be picked up if maggots are present. Garbage bags containing mostly recycling material will not be collected, as we encourage everyone to recycle. **Dark bags will not be picked up.** Bags may be placed inside a garbage container, however, tags must be at the top, clearly visible to the driver (see example). All bags/containers must be in plain view of the driver and cannot be hidden behind a tree, hedge, mailbox, fence or car. Large items and non-essential household waste are not collected at curbside and must be disposed of at the Portland Transfer Station (see tipping fees).

To ensure your waste & recycling is picked up during the winter months, place your bag(s) on top of the snow bank so it is easily visible to the driver. When temperatures drop below 0, bag tags can become less sticky. If this happens, affix your tag to the bag at room temperature before going to the curb or fold the tag around the handle & stick both ends together – see example above (full tag must be visible).

Remember, your bags are *YOURS* until the driver puts them in the truck. If you have issues with birds & critters, place your bags in a container or cover them with a tarp/blanket. If your bags are torn apart before the truck arrives, it is your responsibility to clean up the mess.

Businesses do not receive curbside collection and must dispose of their waste at the Portland Transfer Station. This policy will be strictly enforced.

Stat/Civic Holidays:

When there is a holiday, collection takes place one day later than normal (with the exception of Christmas & New Year's schedules). Only the week in which the holiday falls is affected. Example – when the holiday is on a Monday, collection takes place Tuesday through Friday. When the holiday falls on a Wednesday, collection takes place Thursday through Friday (only Wednesday and Thursday collection is affected).

Private Road Curbside Collection:

All private roads in Rideau Lakes are now potentially eligible for summer and winter curbside collection. Summer collection runs from Victoria Day to Thanksgiving and winter collection runs from Thanksgiving to Victoria Day. The Township has adopted a policy for minimum road standards (width, maintenance etc.) required to obtain one or both types of service. Please check rideaulakes.ca for a copy of the policy and a current listing of eligible roads. If you have questions or would like to discuss what upgrades are required to obtain or enhance your current service, please contact Ben Rothwell at brothwell@rideaulakes.ca or 1-800-928-2250 Ext 230.

County Household Hazardous Waste Day (HHWD):

Never put hazardous waste in your garbage or recycling, as it is not permitted with regular disposal. Materials such as batteries, fluorescent bulbs, paint, oil/gas, must be disposed of at special depot days. In 2026, the Township will again partner with the United Counties of Leeds & Grenville for one Household Hazardous Waste Event in Rideau Lakes. In previous years this special event day has taken place in July in Rideau Lakes. Watch local newspapers, Facebook/Twitter and our website rideaulakes.ca for more information.

Moving to an Enhanced Recycling System:

Circular Materials, a not-for-profit organization and the administrator of the common collection system, is now responsible for Rideau Lakes recycling system. If you have recycling questions, please contact Emterra by email at customercareont@emterra.ca or by phone at 1-888-597-1541.

ALL RECYCLING MUST BE CLEAN and flattened.

Every household is entitled to place 5 bags of recycling material out each week for **FREE** (no bag tag required). All accepted recycling material must be properly sorted, CLEAN, in a clear blue bag, tied and weigh less than 40 lbs. Cans should be crushed and plastics should be flattened when possible. You may bundle and tightly tie your cardboard, newspapers and magazines (no bag required), however you may only place bundles the size of a regular garbage bag out (26" x 36") and only up to 5 bundles (equivalent to 5 bags). If your bundle is too large, it will not be collected.

Note: Recycling material is collected on alternating weeks. Simply follow along with the images at the beginning of each week –  for plastic/ metal weeks,  for paper/cardboard weeks. You can also find the schedule on our website under the recycling page. Plastics/metal containers are collected one week, while paper/cardboard/boxboard is collected the next week. Recycling does not require bag tags.

SUNDAY ISLAND SERVICE – FOR ISLAND/WATER-ACCESS-ONLY PROPERTY OWNERS

The Township is unable to provide water-access-only properties with curbside collection; therefore, any resident who owns property on an island or has strictly water-access-only will benefit from this weekly Sunday Service from Victoria Day weekend to September 6th, 4:00 - 6:00 pm ONLY. If you live on the mainland and have weekly curbside collection, you are not entitled to use this Sunday Service.

This represents islanders/water-access-only residents' curbside collection and all the rules associated with curbside collection apply. For rules and regulations, please read the curbside section or visit our website at rideaulakes.ca.

- 3-bag limit for bagged household waste (with a bag tag on each), 5-bag limit for properly sorted recycling materials (no bag tag required).
- Construction or demolition material and other large items are not accepted during this Sunday Service.

Do not leave your bags at any location before or after the hours of service as this is littering and is a fineable offence of up to \$500 per offence. By-Law #2007-46, prohibits the throwing, placing or depositing of refuse or debris on land without the owner's consent.

Locations: Sand Lake Marine; Franklin's Drive Boat Launch; Portland Harbour; Lower Beverley Lake Park Boat Launch; Newboro Harbour, Forrester's Landing Boat Launch (from 3:15 - 3:45 pm only).

PORLAND TRANSFER STATION (PTS): 4427H Old Kingston Rd, Portland

August 2019 marked the closure of the landfilling operations at the PTS. The Site is now a Transfer Station only and all waste goes into bins and is transferred out. The Site remains open as a Transfer Station on Wednesdays & Saturdays from 8:00 am - 4:00 pm. When visiting the PTS, Township policy requires you to sort and discard material in the proper locations. There are different areas for household wet waste, tires, scrap metal, electronics, construction material, brush/leaves etc. If you are not willing to place your items where they belong, you may be denied access.

Please note: The Transfer Station no longer accepts blue box recyclables due to the transition to producer responsibility for recycling. All other material previously accepted continues to be accepted.

Example: Anything made of metal must go in the scrap metal bin. *Tip: load your vehicle to follow the sorting requirements to help save time when unloading.* Large items (such as mattresses and furniture) and items not collected at curbside can be disposed of during regular hours of operation.

Bag tags are accepted at the PTS for bagged household waste.

Tipping Fees:

All waste entering the PTS is chargeable at a rate of \$222/tonne, with a minimum charge of \$10. Brush is chargeable at \$35/tonne (this includes brush under 8 inches in diameter). Small amounts of construction material are accepted (e.g. drywall, lumber, insulation, carpet/flooring, etc). Demolition material is not accepted. The Township reserves the right to limit the quantity of material brought into the PTS at any one time. **Any bagged waste MUST BE IN CLEAR BAGS (dark bags are not accepted).** The PTS accepts cash, debit, mastercard/visa. Personal cheques are not accepted.

FREE at the Portland Transfer Station (PTS):

Tires (clean & both on and off the rim), electronics, scrap metal, leaves/grass clippings & Christmas trees are free for disposal, when placed in the proper location.

Large Item Disposal:

Here are a few options for you to consider when disposing of a large item: take it to the PTS and pay the applicable charges; take it to a waste disposal company near you; call a local contractor to dispose of it for you; call a family member or neighbour with the means to help you; donate a gently used item to a local charity or post it on social media; place it at the end of your driveway with a "free" sign on it.



Waste & Recycling Collection Map


