The Township of Rideau Lakes is seeking an individual for a Part-time Contract position as a Crossing Guard throughout the school year, September to on or around the end of June, in Elgin Ontario.

POSITION SUMMARY:

Guard designated streets and direct children to ensure safe crossing.

EDUCATION / EXPERIENCE / SKILLS TRAINING:

- Must be at least 16 years of age.
- Establish and maintain effective working relationships with the public.
- Remain calm and use good judgment in emergency situations.
- Work independently without supervision.
- Stand and/or walk for up to three hours per day.
- Work in adverse weather conditions.
- Understand and clearly communicate in the English language.
- Provide a current Vulnerable Sector Check satisfactory to the Township.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Directs actions of children and traffic at street intersections to ensure safe crossing.
- Records license numbers of vehicles disregarding traffic signals and reports infractions.

The regular working hours for this position are 15 hours per week from Monday to Friday, dependent on school schedule, excluding PA days and planned school closures, 1.5 hours prior to school start time and 1.5 hours after school release time. The hourly wage rate is Band 1B Step 4 (\$20.91/hour).
