

## FRONTENAC ARCH BIOSPHERE HIKING TRAIL GUIDE

### About The Trail

The Lower Beverley Lake park is a 106 acre multi-use campground with a 2.5 km interpretive trail loop. Pick up a trail guide when you enter the park and follow the numbers to learn about the native plants and animals living here along with historical remains of the Kingston Pembroke Railway line and prospecting sites. There are 2 alternate pathways to shorten or extend your hike through this beautiful wooded area. The trail spurs at the northeast end towards the beach offering a full day of recreation. The campground features washrooms, showers, arcade and canteen.

The trail is easy to moderate, but hiking boots are recommended.

The park is only minutes away from dozens of local and regional attractions. In Delta, you'll find the Old Stone Mill National Historic Site of Canada, one of the Biosphere's Amazing Places, and the Museum of Industrial Technology (in the Old Town Hall). These are within easy walking distance of the park.


